New Testament Bible Study

*Pastor Kevin's Meditations & Contemplations for Week Twenty-Seven

- (July 3 - 1 Thessalonians 2) "For you are our glory and our joy (1 Thessalonians 2:20).": Who is your glory and joy?

- (July 4 - 1 Thessalonians 3) "So no one should be wagged about by these afflictions. For you yourselves know that we are appointed for this... (1 Thessalonians 3:3).": For what afflictions have you been appointed?

- (July 5 - 1 Thessalonians 4) "And to make it your ambition to be quiet... (1 Thessalonians 4:11a).": Is your ambition to be quiet?

- (July 6 - 1 Thessalonians 5) "And may the God of peace Himself make you holy with absolute completeness, and may the whole of you—spirit and soul and body—be preserved blamelessly at the arrival of our Lord Jesus the Anointed. The One Who calls you—Who will surely do it—is faithful (1 Thessalonians 5:23, 24).": What exactly is God making holy, blameless, and absolutely complete?

- (July 7 - 2 Thessalonians 1) "For which reason we do indeed pray for you always—that our God may deem you worthy of this calling and may fill every intention of goodness and work of faith with power (2 Thessalonians 1:11).": What is the reason for which Paul and his cohorts are praying for the Thessalonians?

- (July 8 - 2 Thessalonians 2) "And hence God sends them delusion's operation, so that they believe the lie (2 Thessalonians 2:11).": How well should you know Christ?

- (July 9 - 2 Thessalonians 3) “Now, brothers, I enjoin you in the name of the Lord Jesus the Anointed to draw back from every brother who walks idly and not according to the traditions you received from us (2 Thessalonians 3:6).”: How close are we to be to those who claim maturity, but are spiritually idle?”

- (July 10 - 1 Timothy 1) “This saying is trustworthy and worthy of all acceptance: that Jesus the Anointed entered the cosmos to save sinners, among whom I am foremost (1 Timothy 1:15).”: *Why is it profitable to view ourselves as foremost among sinners?*

- (July 11 - 1 Timothy 2) “God intends all human beings to be saved and to come to a full knowledge of truth (1 Timothy 2:4).”: *So, are we to understand the Gospel as an inclusive call to the exclusive Christ?*

- (July 12 - 1 Timothy 3) “Guarding the mystery of the faith with a pure conscience (1 Timothy 3:9).”: What does it mean to guard the mystery of the faith with a pure conscience?

- (July 13 - 1 Timothy 4) “Let no one hold your youth in disdain, but instead become a model for the faithful in speech, in comportment, in love, in faithfulness, in purity (1 Timothy 4:12).”: *Why should youth in the local church be celebrated and empowered rather than condescended to as mascots of Christianity?*

- (July 14 - 1 Timothy 5) “Do not entertain an accusation made against an elder except upon the word of two or three witnesses (1 Timothy 5:19).”: *How serious is a charge against an elder in a local assembly?*

- (July 15 - 1 Timothy 6) “To those who are rich in this age...command them to be...communalists (1 Timothy 6:17, 18).”: *Are we to live as communalists?*
- (July 16 - 2 Timothy 1) “But which is now made manifest by the appearing of our Savior the Anointed One Jesus, abolishing death, and having brought life and incorruption to light by the good tidings (2 Timothy 1:10).”: *What are the implications of Jesus’ abolishment of death?*
